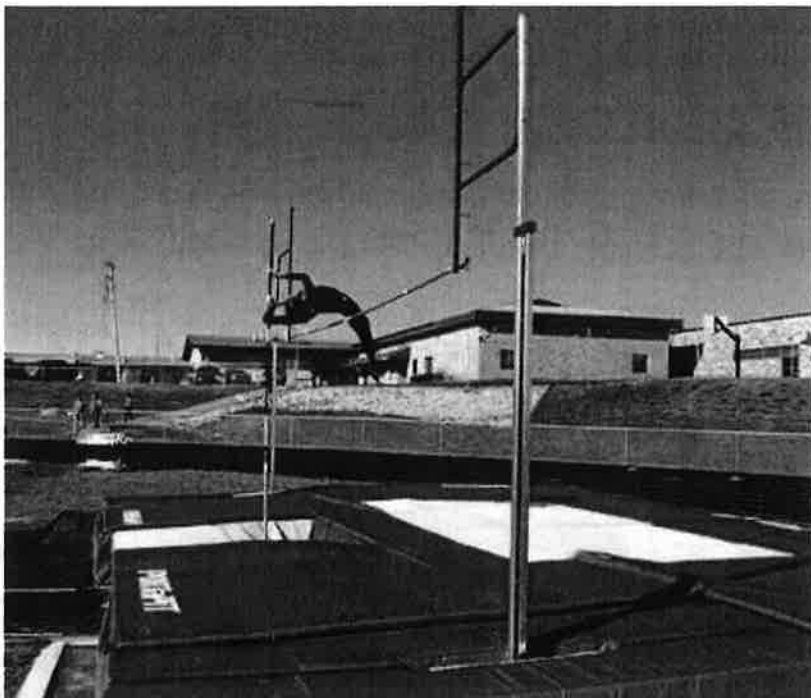
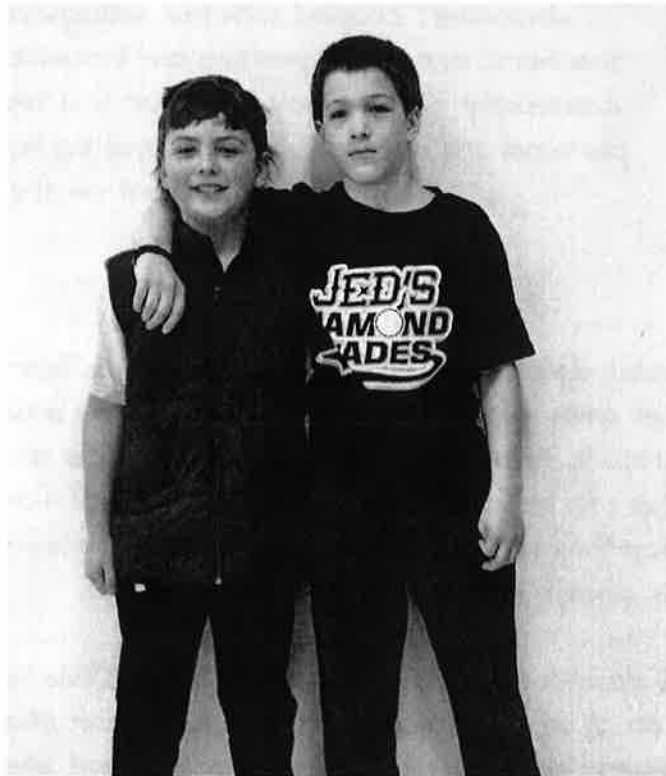

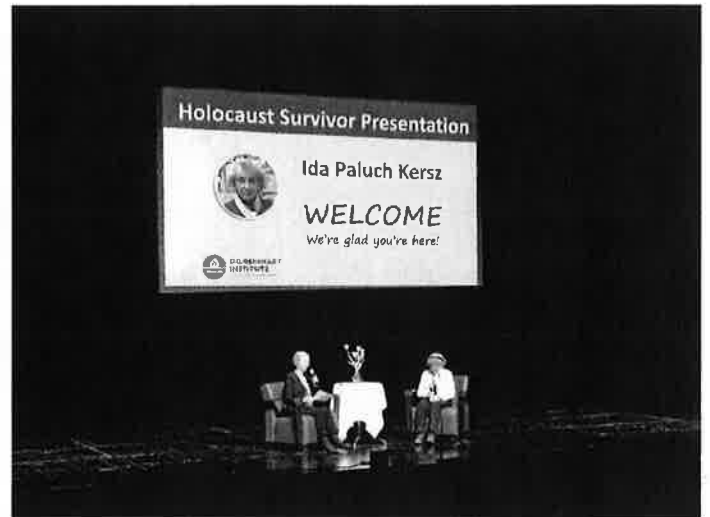
FBLA State Conference

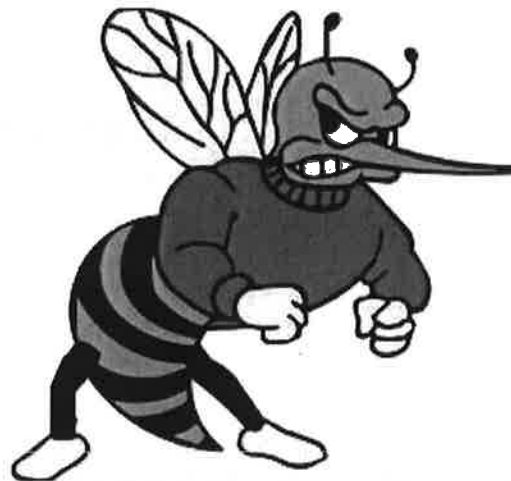
