LOVE IS IN THE AIR

Valentine's Day is the day that everyone shows their love and appreciation towards others. Making sweets is a good way to show that, and below is a recipe for chocolate truffles- the perfect treat for that special someone!

Total time: 3 hrs and 25 min Serves: 30-35 truffles



- 10 ounces of bittersweet chocolate, finely chopped
- 8 ounces of semisweet or bittersweet chocolate, finely chopped
- 3 tablespoons of unsalted butter
- ½ cup of heavy cream
- 1 tablespoon light corn syrup
- = $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Dutch process cocoa powder, finely chopped nuts, and/or toasted coconut (for coating truffles)

Directions:

- Place the 10 ounces of chocolate and butter in a medium glass bowl and microwave for 30 seconds. Remove, stir, and repeat this process one more time. Then set aside.
- Heat the heavy cream and corn syrup in a small saucepan over medium heat until simmering. Remove from heat and pour over the melted chocolate and butter mix. Let stand for 2 minutes before stirring gently with a rubber spatula.
- Once the chocolate is all melted and the texture is smooth and creamy, pour the mixture in an 8-8 inch glass baking dish and place in the refrigerator for 1 hour.
- Scoop chocolate onto a sheet pan lined with parchment paper and let sit in the refrigerator for another 30 mins. It is recommended to use a melon baller for this step.
- Place cocoa powder, nuts and/or coconut in their own separate bowls and set aside.
- Place the 8 ounces of chocolate into a medium mixing bowl, which should be sitting on top of a heating pad lined bowl. The heating pad should be set to medium, although you can adjust the heat accordingly.
- Stir the chocolate occasionally and keep an eye on the temperature. Heat until it reaches 90-92 degrees F. It CANNOT go over 94 degrees, or it won't have a nice snap when you bite into the coating. Adjust the heat to maintain the ideal temperature once you reach it.
- Remove the truffles from the fridge and shape into balls.
- Dip an ice cream scoop into the melted chocolate, and then tip it upside down to remove excess.
- Place 1 truffle at a time into the scoop and move around until evenly covered. Begin placing the now chocolate covered truffle into the bowls of cocoa powder, nuts or coconut as you please. Make sure to leave the truffle in the coating for 10-15 seconds. Repeat for the rest of the truffles and then place it in a cool, dry place or in an airtight container in the fridge for at least 1 hour. Serve at room temperature.
