

Science Fair

Wauzeka-Steuben science fair was on May 5th for grades 6-12. Students were able to demonstrate their research and science fair projects to the community and school. They had worked on the projects for over a semester and were required to write a research paper and present to the community. Some topics were STEM, chemistry, biology and psychology based. Some of the topics were plant growth and light wavelengths, Al self-driving cars, coding robots, plant life in Mars soil, best boba teas, worms for plant growth, wax types for essential oils, skygrow study, concrete strength, pee power, recovery drinks, stroop effect, plastic packaging greenhouse, luminol and blood testing and many other creative experiments.

The Health Career students performed vital signs checks of blood pressure, pulse, temperature and respirations. Science Club students hand on demonstration tables for students in grades K-G. There was also a planetarium that the science club students operated available for student/community viewing. Science club advisor and high school science teacher, Kirsten Reichmann said all projects were well thought out and creative. Middle school science teacher Amber Crary-Pierce and Reichmann are looking forward to a bigger and better science fair next year. 


