Ruger also placed 7th at State where there was a lot of tough competition. Way to go Ruger! We are proud of you! Keep up the great work!







Everyone on this trip had a wonderful time!






Wauzeka-Steuben holds Signing Day


AMERICANISM ESSAY WINNERS




It's "Can"demonium!
