others and was declared the champion. Gabe Kapinus (8th) was close behind as the first runner-up. Meshya Ragan (6th) was declared the alternate.

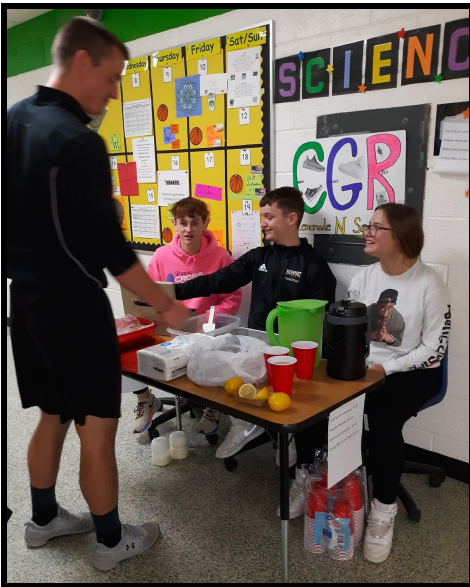

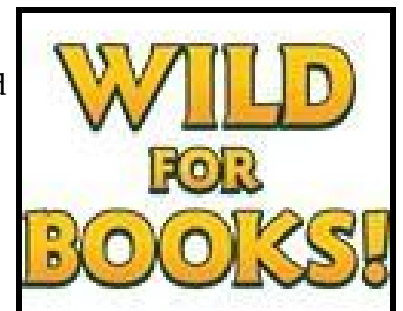

Kindergarten, **Reid Mitchell**



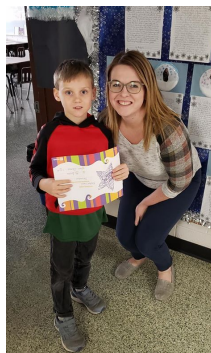

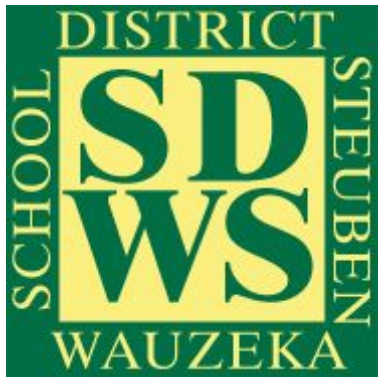
