## SCHOOL DISTRICT OF WAUZEKA-STEUBEN

## PARENT(S)/LEGAL GUARDIAN(S) RIGHTS AND DISTRICT PROGRAMS/ACTIVITIES

Parent(s)/Legal Guardian(s) may inspect, upon request, any instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum for students. In addition, the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) may deny their child's participation in certain District educational programs or activities in accordance with state and federal laws and regulations. Specifically, the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) may:

- 1. Request that their child not participate in instruction in human growth and development or instruction in certain health-related subjects (physiology and hygiene, sanitation, the effects of controlled substances and alcohol upon the human system, symptoms of disease, and the proper care of the body);
- 2. Request that their child not participate in any activities involving the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or selling that information, or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose; "Personal information" includes individually identifiable information such as a student's or parent(s)'s/legal guardian(s)'s first and last name, address, telephone number, WISN, WISE ID or Social Security identification number. Upon request, the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) may inspect any instrument used in the collection of personal information from students for marketing or selling purposes before the instrument is administered or distributed to students.
- 3. Request that their child not participate in any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening that is: (a) required as a condition of attendance; (b) administered by the school and scheduled by the school in advance; and, (c) not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of the student or of other students; "Invasive physical examination" means any medical examination that involves the exposure of private body parts, or any act during such examination that includes incision, insertion, or injection in the body, but does not include a hearing, vision, or scoliosis screening.

Parents/Legal guardians shall be informed at the beginning of the school year of the specific or approximate dates during the school year when activities outlined in items (2) and (3) are scheduled to take place and shall be given the opportunity to request that their child not participate in such activities.

Parents/Legal guardians shall make any of the above requests, in writing, to the principal or his/her designee. All requests shall be judged individually based upon state and federal guidelines. The principal or his/her designee shall respond to such requests in a timely manner.

The District shall inform the parent(s)/legal guardian(s) of this policy at the beginning of each school year.
